


Extended Session starts October 18th!

Join Us For Sunday School on Zoom

Mr. Bob Kruschwitz will be leading us through our final discussion of the book *Resilient Faith: How the Early Christian "Third Way" Changed the World* by Gerald L. Sittser this Sunday at 9:15 am via Zoom. Beginning Sunday, October 25th, we will begin our discussion of the Gospel according to Mark. Mark is by far the shortest Gospel, and likely the first one Christians knew. What should we make of it? It begins and ends rather abruptly; it repeats (similar) stories and jams other stories together; its language is ordinary and rough, not elevated; its herky-jerky story-telling style can be off-putting; it is full of mystery. We'll study this amazing book a few chapters at a time, the way early Christians probably read it. The discussion will lead us through the end of Pentecost. Come join us every Sunday at 9:15 am on Zoom as we fellowship and grow as Christians.
